



The online Master of Science in Healthcare **Administration** was designed for patient care, healthcare administration, or health information management professionals seeking career advancement, and professionals with management experience in a non-healthcare environment seeking a career in healthcare administration. The curriculum focuses on skills and knowledge specific to healthcare, including financial management, strategic leadership, technology, data analytics, and information

governance, communications and marketing, quality and performance improvement, healthcare law and policy, and human resources.

You'll graduate with an understanding of dynamic and complex healthcare environments and be qualified for leadership roles, such as health services director, clinical manager, medical director, health program manager, chief nursing officer, and healthcare administrator, in a variety of healthcare settings, urban to rural.

According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, employment of medical and health services managers is projected to grow 32 percent from 2019 to 2029, much faster than the average for all occupations. Key drivers of growth include continued high demand for healthcare services and an aging population.

You'll find a range of rewarding job opportunities in nearly any healthcare setting—hospitals, physician's offices, surgical centers, assisted living and skilled nursing facilities, insurance companies, veterans affairs systems, pharmaceutical companies, and medical supply vendors.

In the Capstone, typically taken in the final semester, you'll design a project that aligns with your interests and healthcare administration career goals. Students often discover rewarding job opportunities and professional connections during the capstone.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Bachelor's degree, in any discipline, from an accredited university (min. 3.0 GPA)
- Prerequisite coursework: elementary statistics, medical terminology, and oral communication/public speaking

You will also need to submit the following application materials:

- >> Official college transcripts
- >> Your resume
- >> Two letters of recommendation
- A personal statement of up to 1,000 words

The GMAT and GRE are not required.
